

Assessment and Case Management Services

Assessment - A collection of in-depth information about a client's situation and function so a comprehensive plan of care can be made to meet his or her needs.

Information and Assistance - Provide aging and disability information, assistance, and resources.

Referrals - Proper placement with professionals or agencies qualified to help resolve problems or meet needs.

Case Management - Maintaining client contact to ensure that appropriate, comprehensive, and timely services are received.

Family Caregiver Support Services

National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP)

A federally funded program that is unique from all other aging service programs because it provides assistance to the family caregiver. Under the caregiver program two types of caregivers are identified which include persons caring for a frail elderly individual and grandparents or relative caregivers who are raising their grand-children. A caregiver under this program can receive assistance through information and referral services, respite care, supplemental care, counseling, training, and support groups. Caregivers must meet the following criteria:

- A caregiver caring for a frail elderly individual 60 years of age or older or caring for an individual of any age with a diagnosis of early onset Alzheimer's Disease.
- A grandparent or relative caregiver raising a grandchild must be 55 years of age or older and raising a grandchild who is under the age of 18. Also eligible are grandparents or relative caregivers who are 55 years of age or older and caring for a disabled grandchild who is 18 years of age or older.

Kentucky Caregiver Support Program (KCSP)

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

- A grandparent who is the primary caregiver for a grandchild 18 years of age or younger.
- All household income must be at or below 150% of the federal poverty guideline.
- A grandparent cannot be receiving Kinship Care.
- A grandparent must be related to the grandchild by blood, marriage, or adoption which occurred through the child's parents.
- The child's parents cannot live in the home with the grandparents.
- Grandparents who adopt their grandchild are only eligible if they are not receiving federal or state adoption subsidies. The grandparent is only eligible for one year from the date of the adoption order.
- Grandparent must be a resident of Kentucky.

The Barren River Area Development District Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living (BRADD/AAAIL) is an agency designated by the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the Department of Aging and Independent Living to identify the needs of the elderly disabled population throughout the ten county Barren River Area Development District (BRADD). The BRADD/AAAIL is responsible for developing and administering in-home community based services that assist the elderly and disabled population to maintain their independence as well as their quality of life within their own homes and communities. The BRADD service area includes Allen, Barren, Butler, Edmonson, Hart, Logan, Metcalfe, Monroe, Simpson and Warren Counties. The BRADD/AAAIL is governed by the BRADD Board of Directors, advised by the Barren River Council on Aging, and administered by the Barren River Development District administrative staff.

In Home Services

Home management - Housekeeping services to aid a person in activities of daily living such as cleaning, shopping and laundry.

Personal Care - Services to aid the client in personal care activities such as bathing, dressing and hair care.

Respite - Limited in-home services to provide relief for a caregiver.

Home Delivered Meals - Nutritious meals can be delivered to persons 60 years of age who are homebound because of an illness or disability.

Personal Care Attendant Program - Provides personal care attendant services for mentally alert, severely physically disabled adults 18 years of age and older.

Escort - Personal accompaniment of a frail elderly person who requires assistance to and from a medical appointment.

Consumer Directed Options Program - Provides eligible Medicaid Waiver Clients greater choices in selecting care providers for non-medical waiver services which include: Respite, Personal Care, Homemaking and Attendant Care.

Community Services

Aging and Disability Resource Center: The Barren River Aging and Disability Resource Center provides citizens with information and assistance related to services and support for individuals 60 years of age or older and/or disabled.

Adult Day Health Care - A center providing a safe structured environment for persons needing supervision due to poor health and/or mental confusion.

Ombudsman - A program designed to receive, investigate, resolve, and report complaints on behalf of residents in long-term care facilities.

Legal Services - This program provides legal assistance, consultation and representation to seniors and disabled.

SHIP (State Health Insurance Assistance Program) - Benefits Counseling - A benefits counselor provides older and/or disabled individuals, one-on-one, assistance with the often complicated and confusing red tape of Social Security, SSI, Medicare, Medicare Advantage, Medicare Part D, Medicaid, and other public and private benefits.

Social, Nutritional, and Health Promotion Services

Senior Center Services - Transportation, Outreach, Information and Assistance, Friendly Visiting, Health Promotion, Telephone Reassurance, Nutrition Education, Congregate and Home Delivered Meals are all services offered by the senior centers specifically designed for seniors. In addition to these services, the senior centers provide socialization, recreation, exercise, arts, crafts, education classes, and an overall enjoyable place to participate.

Disease Prevention Health Promotion Services - This program is designed to maintain or improve the health and well being of older persons. Services include: Risk Assessment, Health Promotion, Medication Screening and Education.
